



Judson University Community Expectations

As we prepare our community to be safe on campus in light of COVID-19, there are a number of things we want you to know about community expectations. As you know, this landscape is ever-evolving, and there may be changes throughout the summer and fall as we follow guidelines given to us by health officials. We thank you for your commitment to keeping us all safe.

BEFORE YOU ARRIVE

Testing

The university does not plan to require students to be tested before arriving on campus.

Symptom Checking

University personnel will be performing COVID-19 symptom checking and temperature checks upon each families arrival. These will be performed in your vehicle at your assigned check in station.

What to Pack

- facial coverings (more than one, so that you can wash them frequently);
- hand sanitizer (check for recommended ingredients);
- sanitizing wipes, so that you can help us clean frequently touched surfaces often.
- students are responsible for supplying the cleaning products that they will use to clean their rooms.
- Residence Life is able to provide limited cleaning products in the event that there is a need, but please know they will not be widely available to the community and students should plan to bring their own. Please see resources section of this document for a list of EPA approved COVID-19 cleaning products, as well as an infographic on proper usage.

WELCOME WEEKEND AND MOVE IN

Welcome Weekend

Welcome Weekend will take place primarily in-person, although certain elements of orientation may be modified for students that cannot meet in person for various reasons related to COVID-19. Please contact Hannah Garrett (hannah.tolentino@judsonu.edu) for any questions regarding Welcome Weekend.

Move-In

New students (and current students, if necessary) will be allowed two guests to assist in unpacking and room set up. Student must register guests through the Welcome Weekend page (<https://www.judsonu.edu/WelcomeWeekend/>). All students and their move-in helpers should wear a facial covering during the entire move-in process. Guests will be allowed to remain on campus until the allocated guest/parent departure time on Friday afternoon. We ask that all guests promptly leave campus at this time.

WHAT TO EXPECT WHEN YOUR RETURN TO CAMPUS

Symptom Tracking

In addition to general health care, we will implement symptom-tracking in the community.

Social Distancing (6-feet)

We are modifying shared spaces with staggered seating, creating buffered zone areas and adding some physical barriers to allow people to operate in the workplace while still maintaining a healthy physical distance from colleagues, community members and visitors. In outdoor spaces, social distancing is encouraged. If socially distanced outdoors, you do not have to wear a facial covering. If social distancing cannot be maintained outdoors, facial coverings should be worn at all times.

Increased Sanitization

We have implemented heightened cleaning measures to ensure the health and well-being of our members. We will disinfect common areas more frequently and will have a limited number of cleaning products for students to use as needed to disinfect their own space. Housekeeping and building personnel will provide feedback on special needs in their areas.

Behavioral Signage

New cleaning standards and capacity protocols will be reinforced with strategically-placed signage. These will be consistent reminders to community members and guests that the well-being of our community depends on all of us to do our part. This signage will also include reminders about hygiene practices and wearing PPE.

Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) and Hygiene

Good hand hygiene and the use of appropriate PPE, including masks or face coverings, will be essential to prevent person-to-person transmission of COVID-19 in our community. Students, faculty, staff and visitors are required to wear facial coverings in public areas and inside all buildings. Facial coverings will be required outdoors when social distancing cannot be maintained.

Dining Services

- Students will be allowed several options for dining.
Green Boxes will be available for purchase for any student wanting to fill their to-go container from the Dining Hall and take it to eat on their own at any time that the Dining Hall is open.
- Due to limited space in the dining hall to comply with city regulations, students with meals plans will be asked to complete an assigned meal time questionnaire indicating their first and second preference for dining time options. They will assigned a meal time for each meal based on their completed questionnaires. If a student's schedule changes, they may fill out a meal time change request form, or they may take a Green Box and eat outside the Dining Hall.
- Hours at Riverside Café will remain the same, and additional menu items will be added at this location to provide additional meal options for students. Please note that students are not able to use meals from their selected meal plan at Riverside, and will need to pay in Eagle Bucks in order to purchase food at this location.

Residence Life

For the first few weeks of the fall semester, Judson University will not allow guests in the residence halls. Open dorm will also be temporarily suspended, and on campus residents will be asked not to visit residence halls they do not reside in. Students may still socialize with each other, wearing masks, and socially distanced, in public lounges not located in residence halls, or outside. Residence hall parlors, kitchens and other common spaces will either be closed or have occupancy limits posted.

Judson University also has common kitchen areas. Because of the changes Dining Services meal options and the emphasis on limiting off-campus travel, we feel it is important for students to have access to a kitchen to prepare their own food. Students will be responsible for cleaning the area before and after use using provided cleaning supplies.

GENERAL PROTOCOL

1. All community members will exercise a safe social distance (at least six feet) at all times
2. Students, staff, faculty, and visitors are required to wear a facial covering in public areas inside of all buildings. Facial coverings will be required outdoors when social distancing cannot be maintained.
3. Residence Halls will be cleaned multiple times by Plant Operations Staff.
4. All proposed college events must be evaluated to determine if they can be held safely. Events should be held virtually, outdoors, or in indoor spaces that allow social distancing. If an event cannot happen safely, it will be cancelled.
5. All community members should be flexible and allow community expectations to evolve as CDC and government guidelines change.
6. All community members will engage with the educational and information tools provided by the university in response to COVID-19.
