



Certificate in Community Music

The Certificate in Community Music at Judson University is a non-degree program designed for individuals who desire to deepen their knowledge and skills in the community music field. Students will explore online courses such as Instructional Methods for Community Music and Global Music Education Across Cultures and develop their performance and group teaching skills by working with the dedicated Judson music professors. A baccalaureate degree in music or equivalent level of performance skill is required.

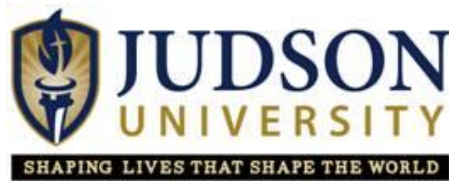
